WHEREAS: The Florida Alliance for Assistive Services and Technology is a leader for

assistive technology services in the state for 27 years, providing no cost services that include providing, educating on, and financing assistive

technology devices; and

WHEREAS: The Center for Independent Living Jacksonville and other professional

organizations actively facilitate access to and acquisition of assistive

technology throughout Jacksonville.
