- **WHEREAS:** IBS is a chronic illness that affects approximately 45 million people in the United States. IBS can be diarrhea dominant, constipation dominant, or a combination of the two; and
- **WHEREAS:** Little is known about IBS and there is currently no known cure for the disease; and
- **WHEREAS:** Millions of individuals continue to be afflicted by the uncomfortable, painful, and personal symptoms of IBS with little hope for relief; and
- **WHEREAS:** Increased awareness and research are crucial to uncovering the causes behind IBS and ways to treat, cure, or otherwise manage the distressing symptoms caused by IBS; and
- **WHEREAS:** More investment is needed in research, treatment, and awareness of Irritable Bowel Syndrome.
- **NOW, THEREFORE, I, LENNY CURRY,** by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby proclaim April 2022 as
