

- WHEREAS: In 1922, Ninah Cummer founded the Garden Club of Jacksonville at what is now the Cummer Museum of Art and Gardens. The Garden Club was founded to focus on city planning projects and the revitalization of Jacksonville's parks; and
- **WHEREAS:** The Garden Club was instrumental in creating spaces like Memorial Park and preserving many of the city's ancient live oak trees; and
- WHEREAS: With help from philanthropist Jessie Ball duPont, The Garden Club helped rescue the historic Treaty Oak, a landmark located in what is now Jessie Ball duPont Park; and
- **WHEREAS:** Now in its 100th year, the Garden Club serves as a beautiful event space and nonprofit dedicated to environmental and horticultural education. It has more than 1,000 members and hosts several public educational and philanthropic events every month.
