WHEREAS: Every year, hundreds of thousands of people are diagnosed with breast

cancer. While women make up 99% of all breast cancer diagnoses, breast

cancer can affect people of any sex; and

WHEREAS: In Florida, 110,000 cases of breast cancer are diagnosed annually. Of the

almost 3,200 Floridians who die from breast cancer every year, 136 of them

are from Duval County; and

WHEREAS: While people of all races, genders, and age can be diagnosed with breast

cancer, in the United States, African American women die from breast

cancer at a rate that is 41% higher than their white counterparts.

WHEREAS: If caught early, breast cancer is often responsive to treatment. Jacksonville

is fortunate to be the home to 4 nationally-ranked medical research facilities. Jacksonville residents and visitors have access to cutting-edge treatments, therapies, and other tools to help them win their fight against

cancer; and

WHEREAS: The fight to end breast cancer would not be possible without the support

from nonprofit organizations. Organizations like the Sista Strut, organized by the Law Offices of Ron Sholes, raise funds to help raise awareness of the need for screening, research, and treatment for breast cancer, especially

among women of color in our community; and

WHEREAS: For the last seven years, the Sista Strut has been the largest organized walk

in Jacksonville specific to the issue of breast cancer among women of color;

and

WHEREAS: The 7th Annual Law Offices of Ron Sholes Sista Strut will serve to raise

awareness of the prevalence of breast cancer among women of color in Jacksonville, the need for early screening and diagnosis, and the resources

already available in Jacksonville.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LENNY CURRY, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby proclaim October 1, 2022
