WHEREAS: The Jacksonville Public Library (JPL) consists of over twenty regional,

community, and neighborhood branches and offers programming, resources, and other services to community members of all ages; and

WHEREAS: The Regency Square Branch opened on January 25, 1973, on the

southeast corner of Regency Square Boulevard and Old Mill Cove

Road; and

WHEREAS: When it opened, the Regency Square Branch was the largest branch

in the system, serving 67,000 residents in the Regency and Arlington

neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS: In 1999, the Regency Square Branch was renovated and reopened,

adding over 5,000 square feet to the property, and increasing the

collection size to 75,000 items; and

WHEREAS: Today, the Regency Square Branch offers 83,966 total items for

checkout. In 2022, the branch served over 92,000 customers; and

WHEREAS: For the last five decades, the Regency Square Branch of the

Jacksonville Public Library has provided educational opportunities and programming to hundreds of thousands of Jacksonville's residents. It remains an institution of learning and growth for families throughout

the Regency Square area.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LENNY CURRY, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby recognize January 25, 2023 as the
