grows outside the Uterus, causing pain and/or infertility; and

**WHEREAS:** Endometriosis affects roughly 200 million individuals across the globe. It can

affect women and girls from all races, ethnicities, and socioeconomic

backgrounds; and

**WHEREAS:** Endometriosis is a chronic disease that negatively impacts the quality of life

of those diagnosed with it. It can cause severe pain, fatigue, nausea, depression, anxiety, and infertility. It can take an average of 10 years to properly diagnose, and affected youth can miss out on crucial school and

social moments; and

**WHEREAS:** Currently, there is no known cure for endometriosis, and treatment is

centered around pain and symptom management. Access to early diagnosis and treatment is crucial, but is often lacking in low- and middle-income

communities; and

**WHEREAS:** The variety of symptoms and a lack of awareness of Endometriosis can lead

to a delay between onset of symptoms and final diagnosis; and

WHEREAS: Shed A light On ENDO (SALO) is a virtual event taking place February 28 –

March 1, 2023. SALO serves to connect individuals and resources, raise awareness, and support those living with Endometriosis in the Jacksonville

community; and

WHEREAS: It is imperative to raise awareness of Endometriosis and continue to invest

in research, wide-spread early detection, screenings, treatments, and possible prevention of this disease. Individuals can show their support by

wearing yellow to raise awareness of Endometriosis in Jacksonville.
