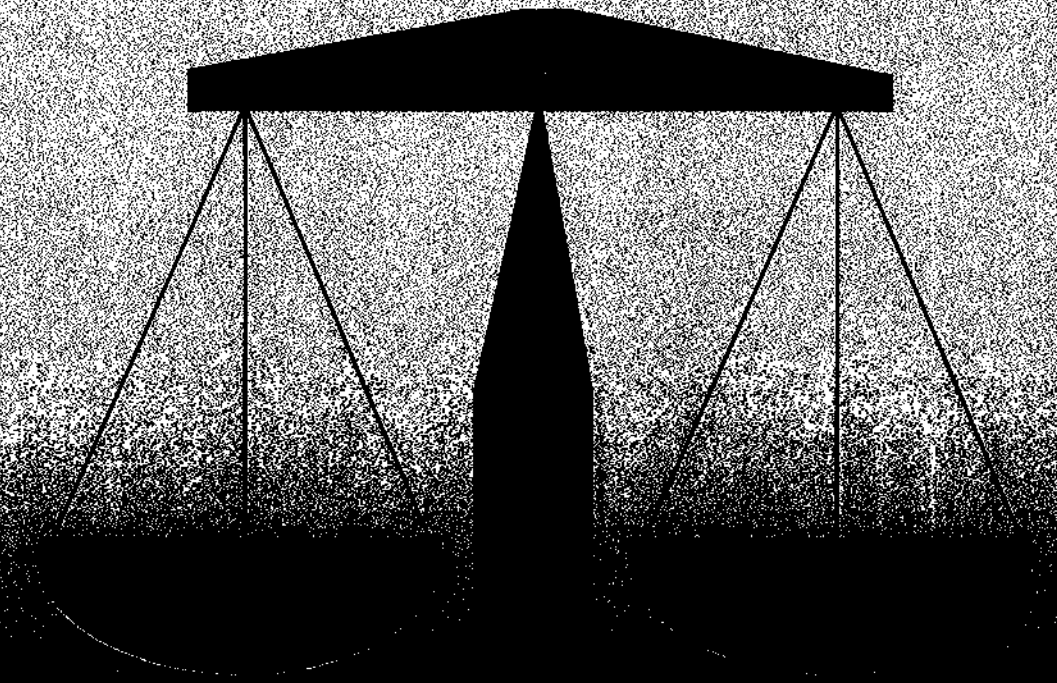

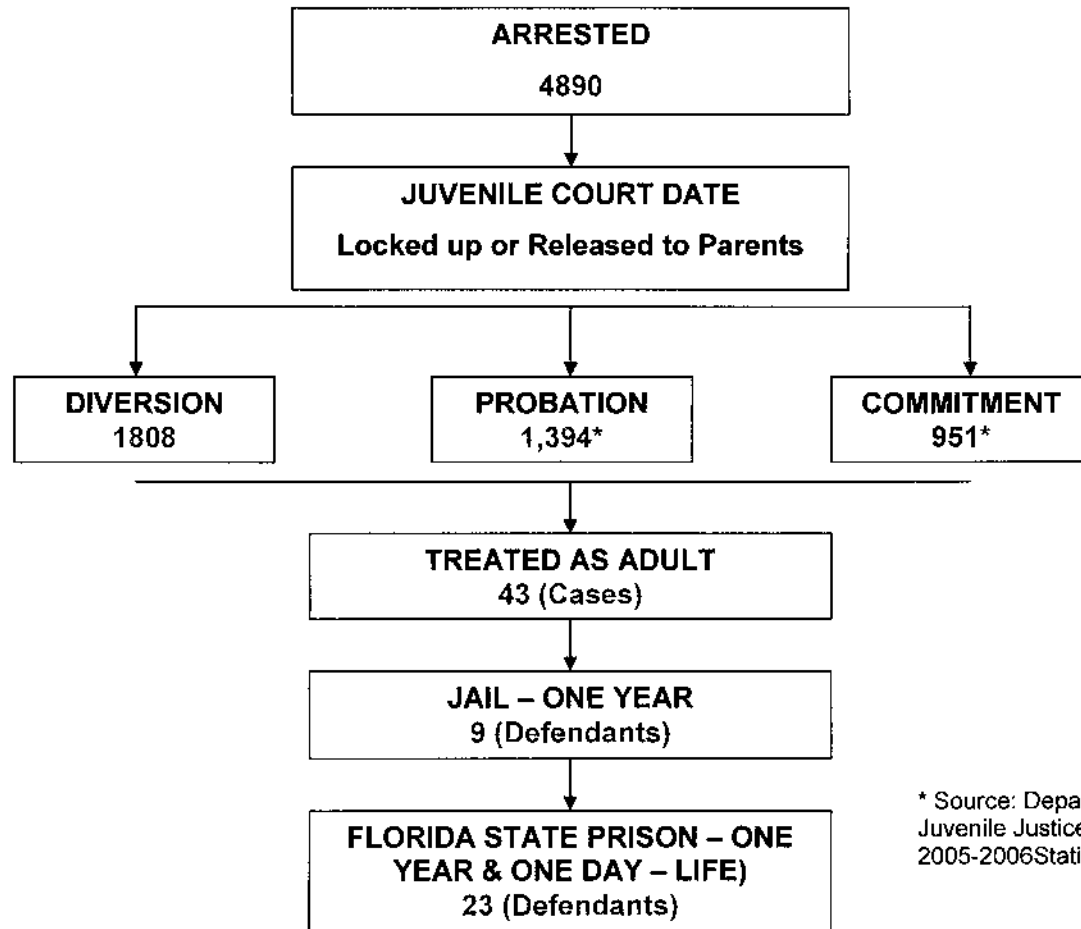

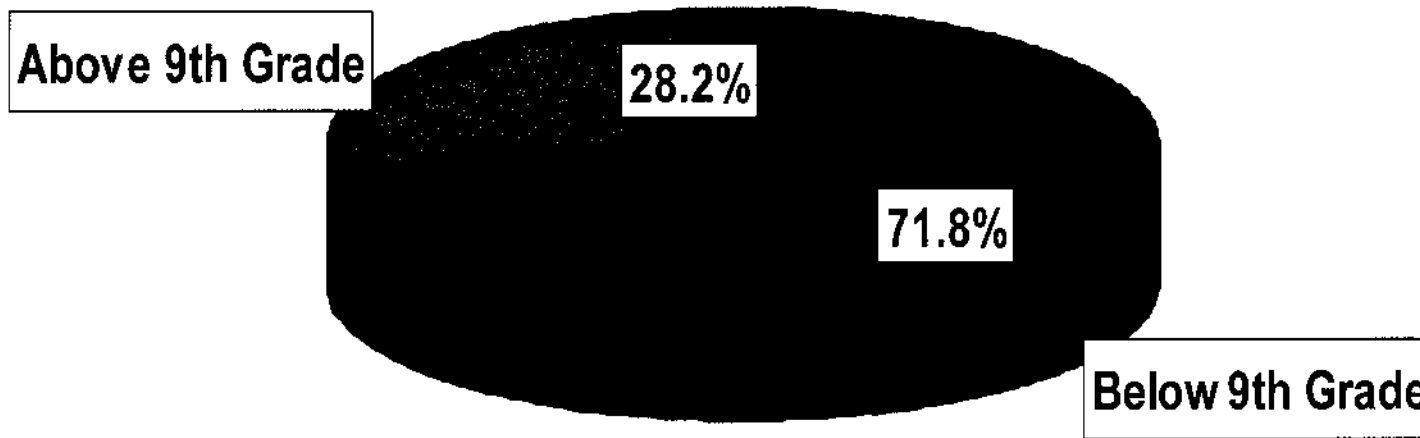

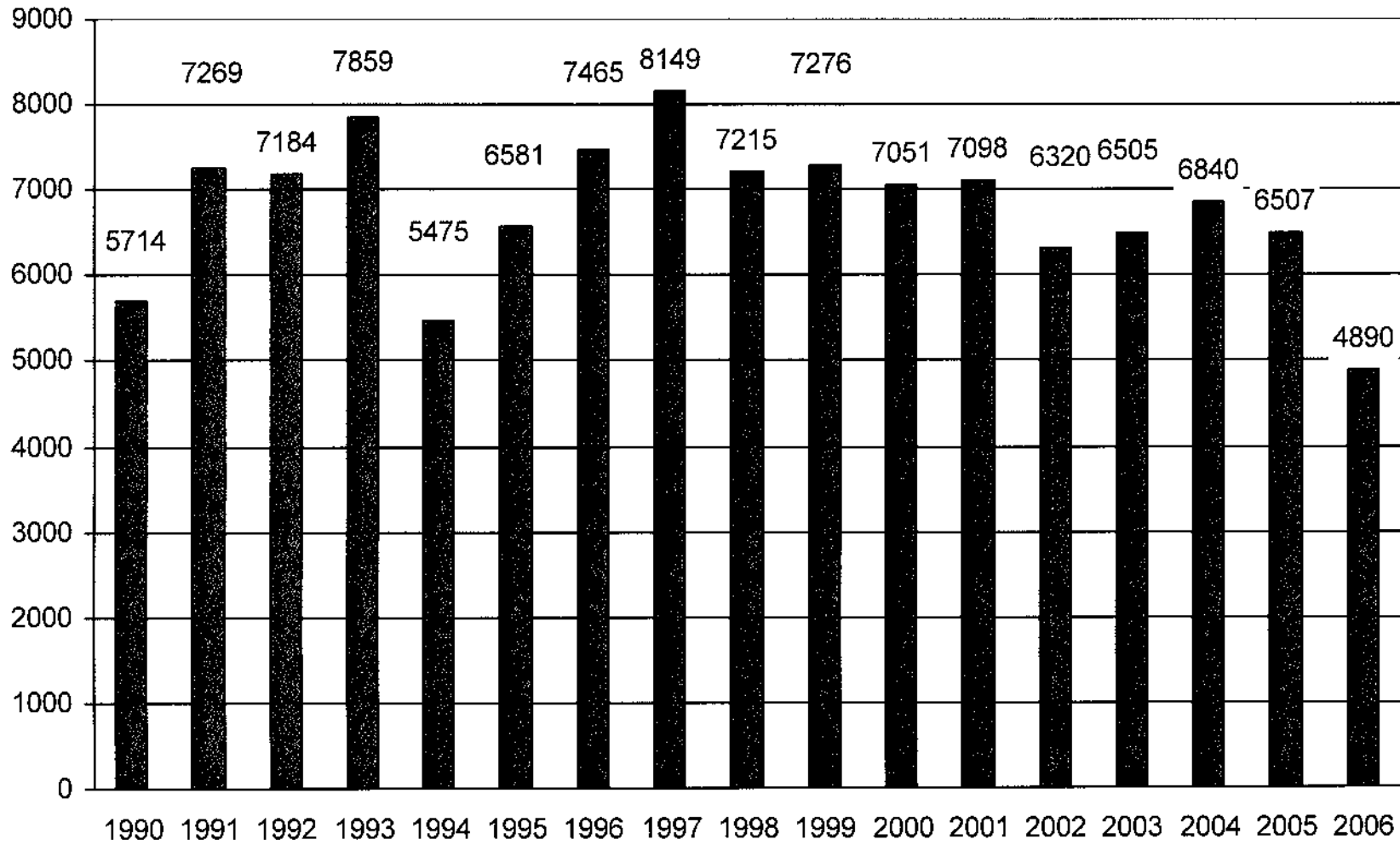
Florida Department of Corrections Inmate Literacy Skill Levels 2006

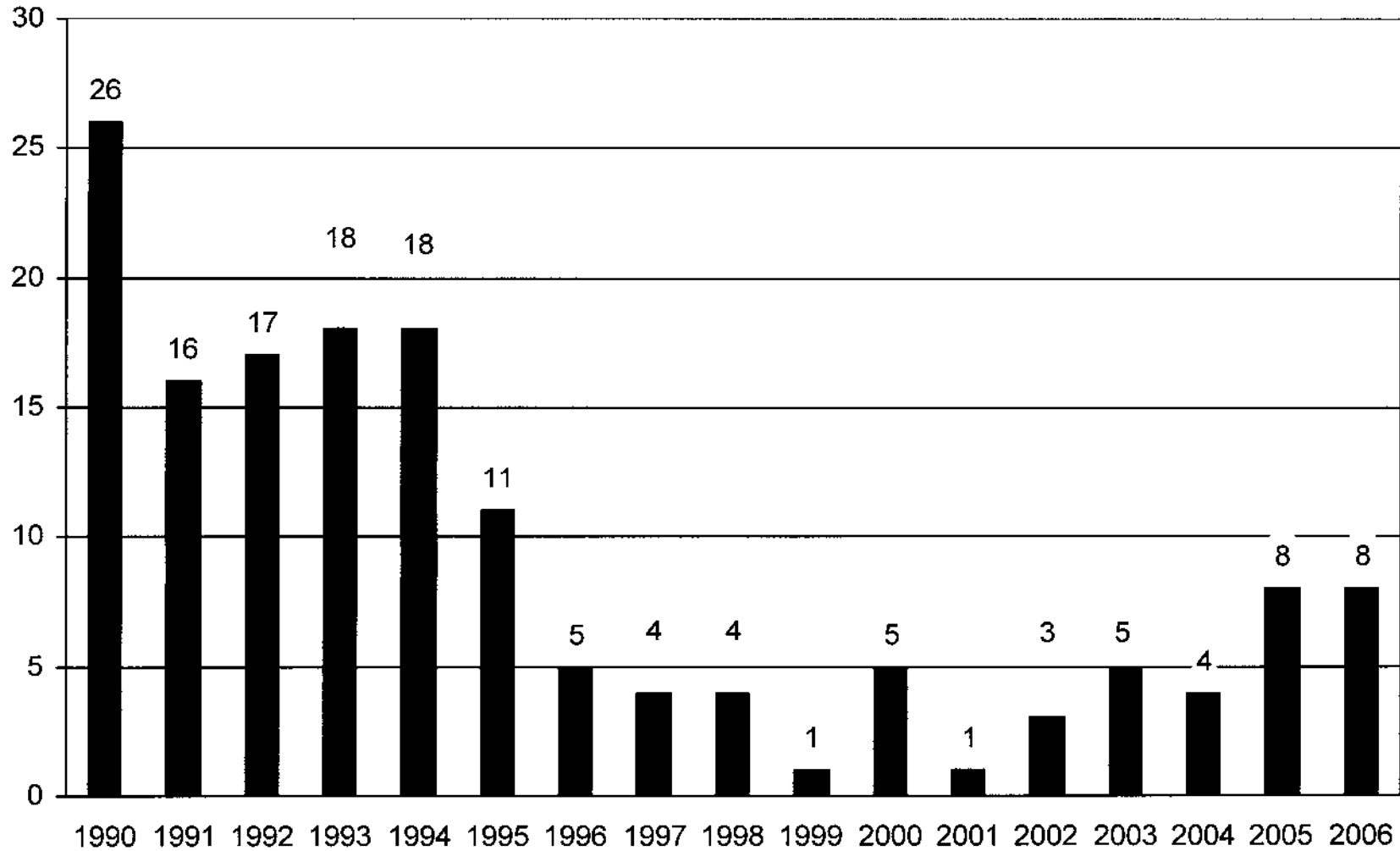

Juvenile Arrests - Murder

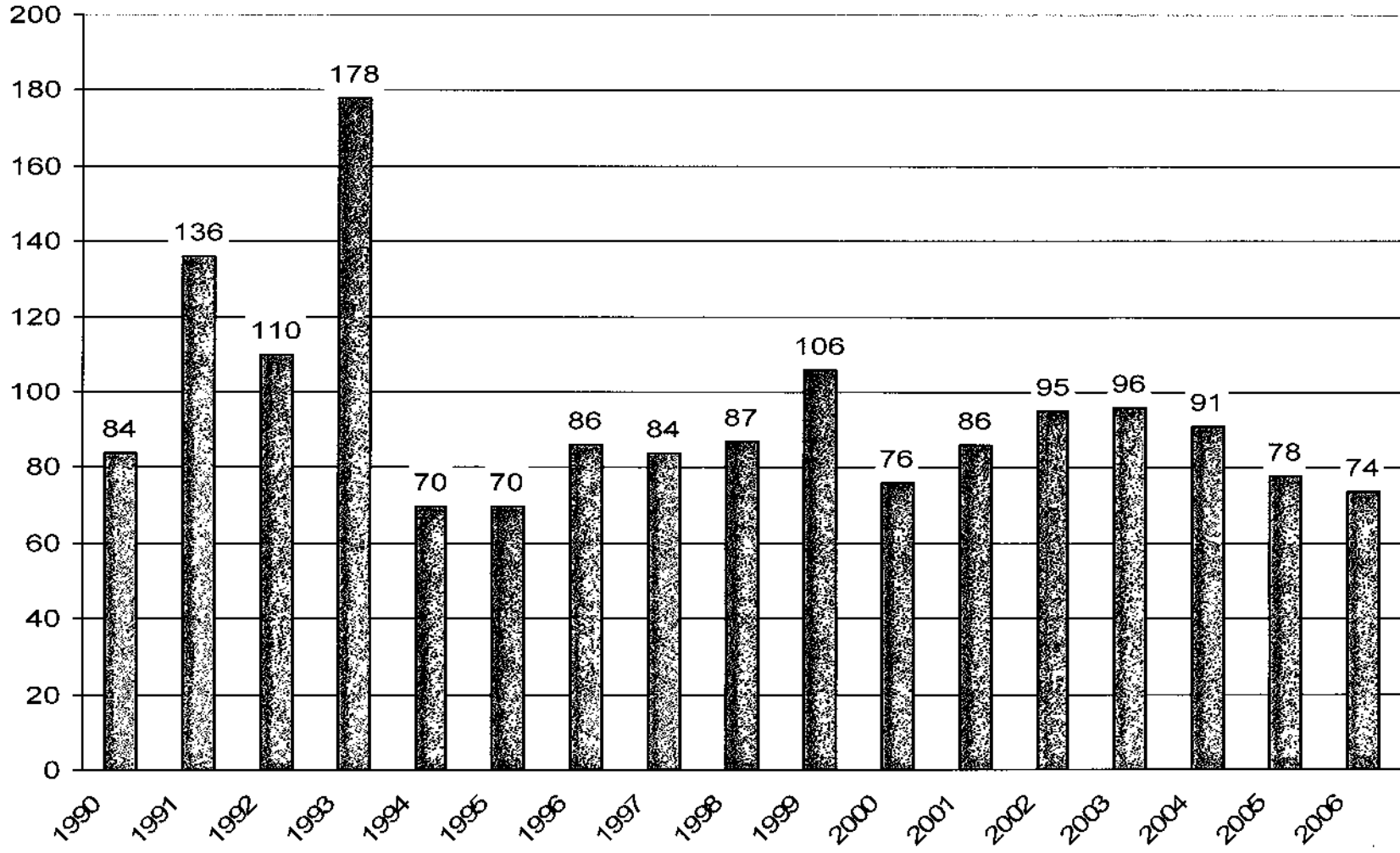

Juvenile Arrests - Rape and Other Sex Offenses

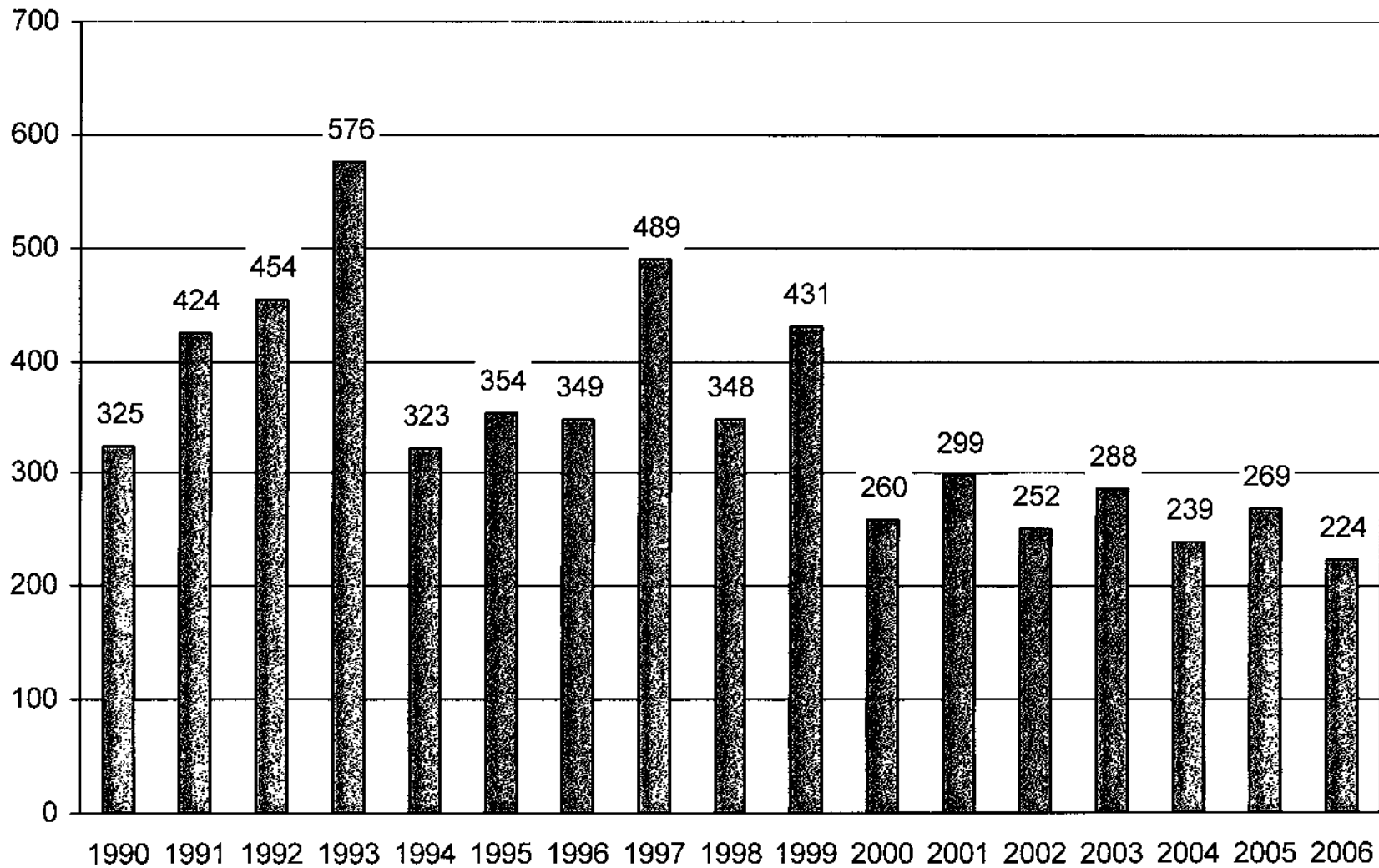

Juvenile Arrests - Aggravated Assault

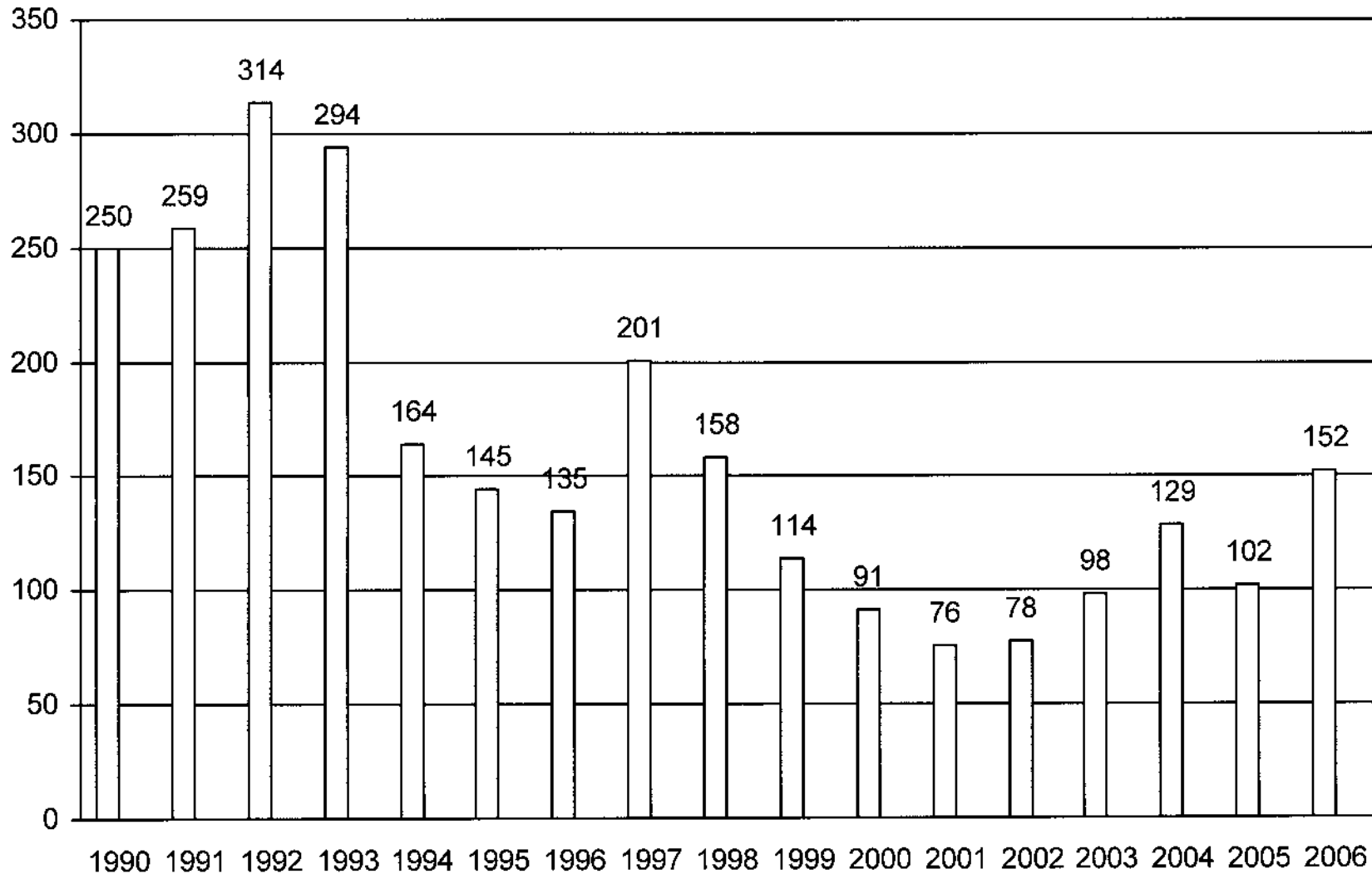

Juvenile Arrests - Robbery

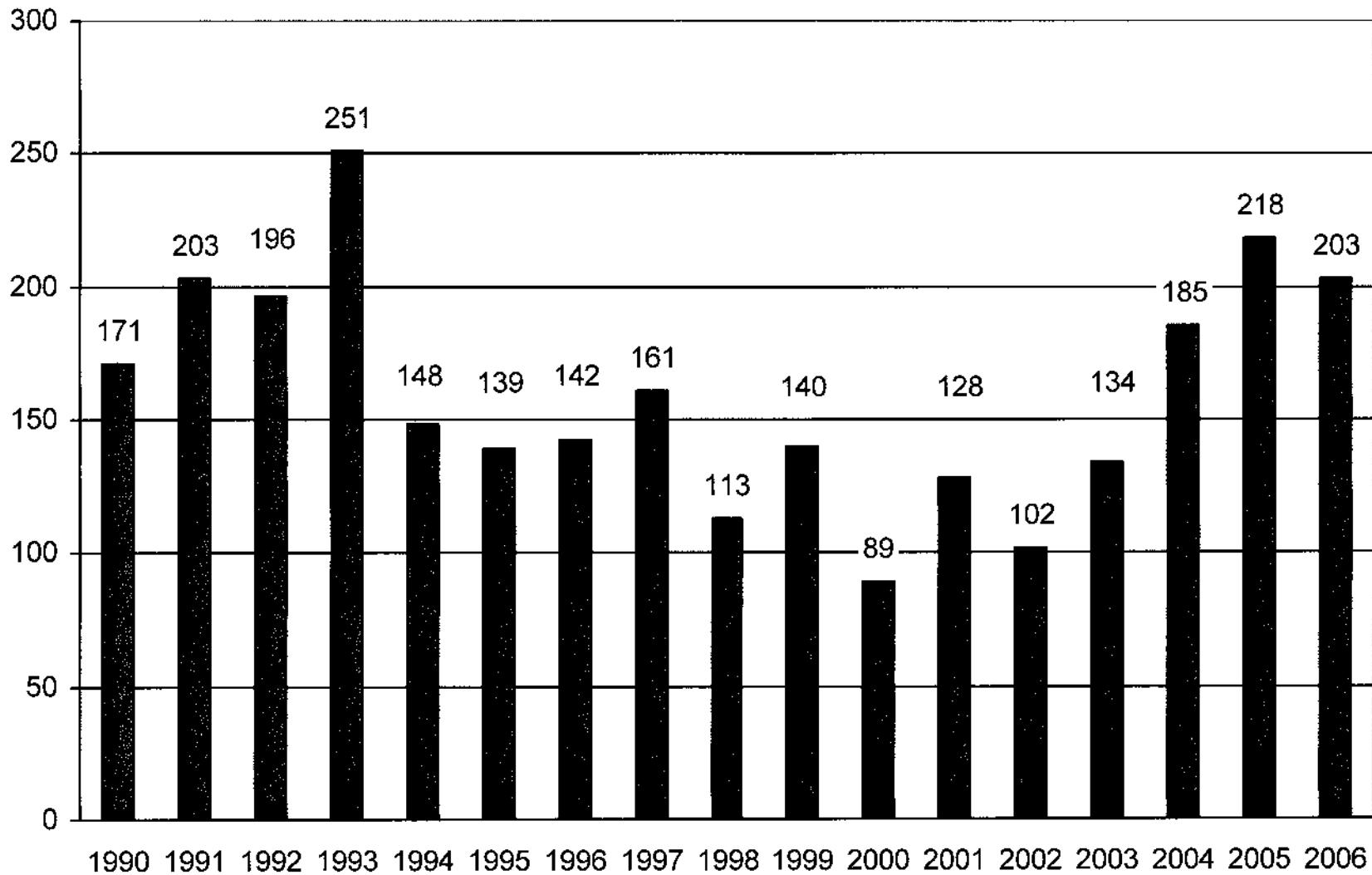

Juvenile Arrests - Weapons

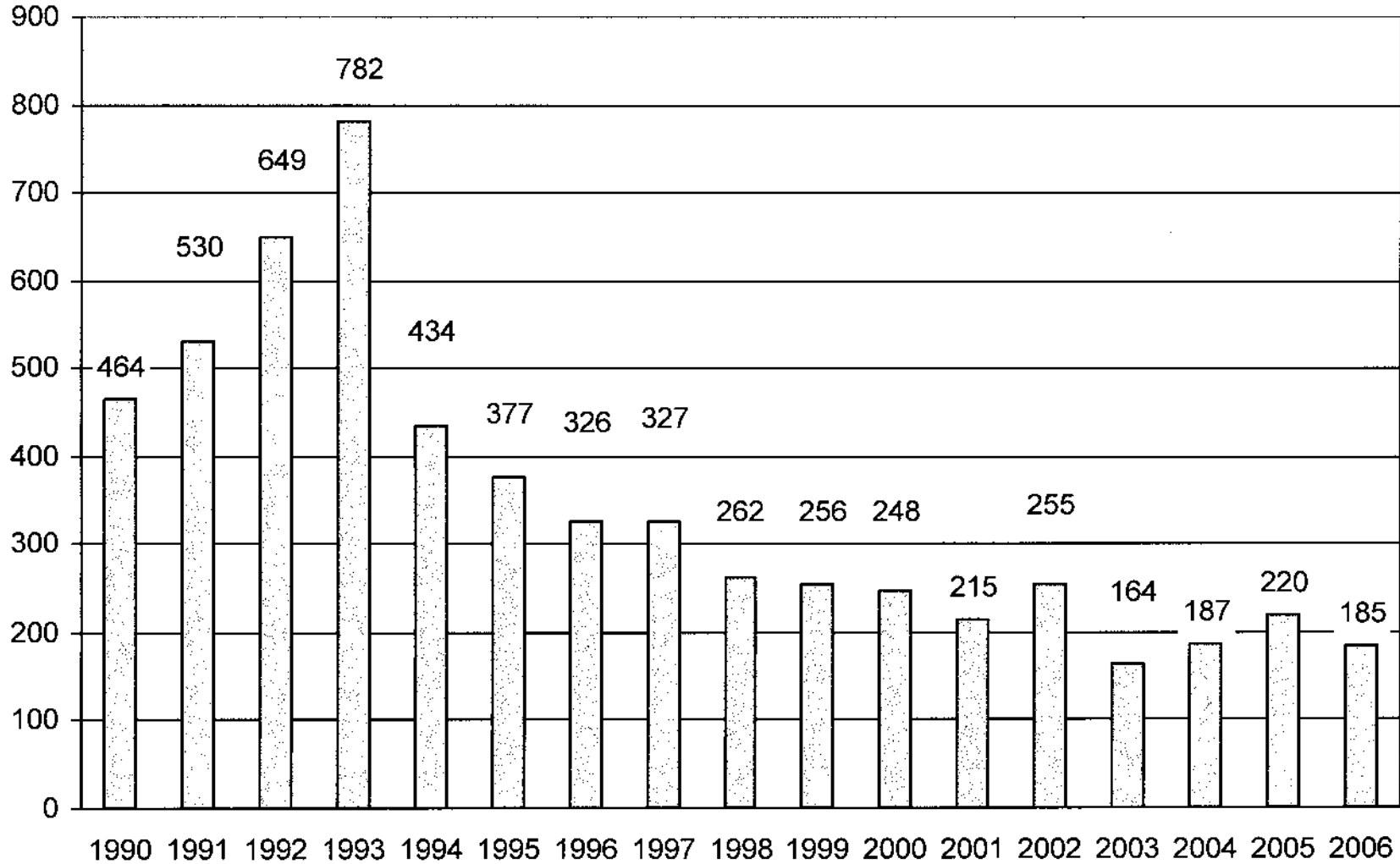

Juvenile Arrests - Vehicle Theft

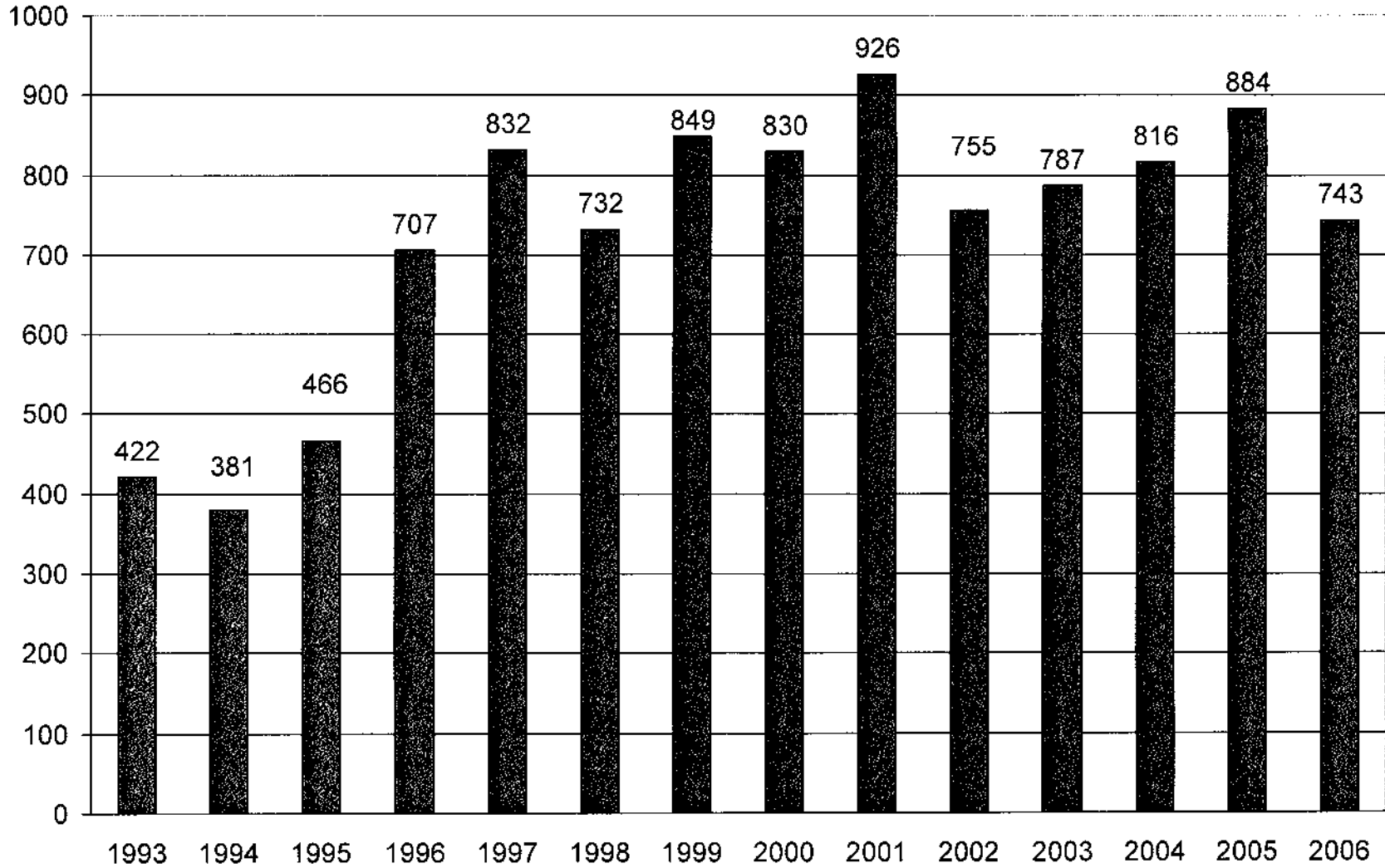

Juvenile Arrests - Narcotics

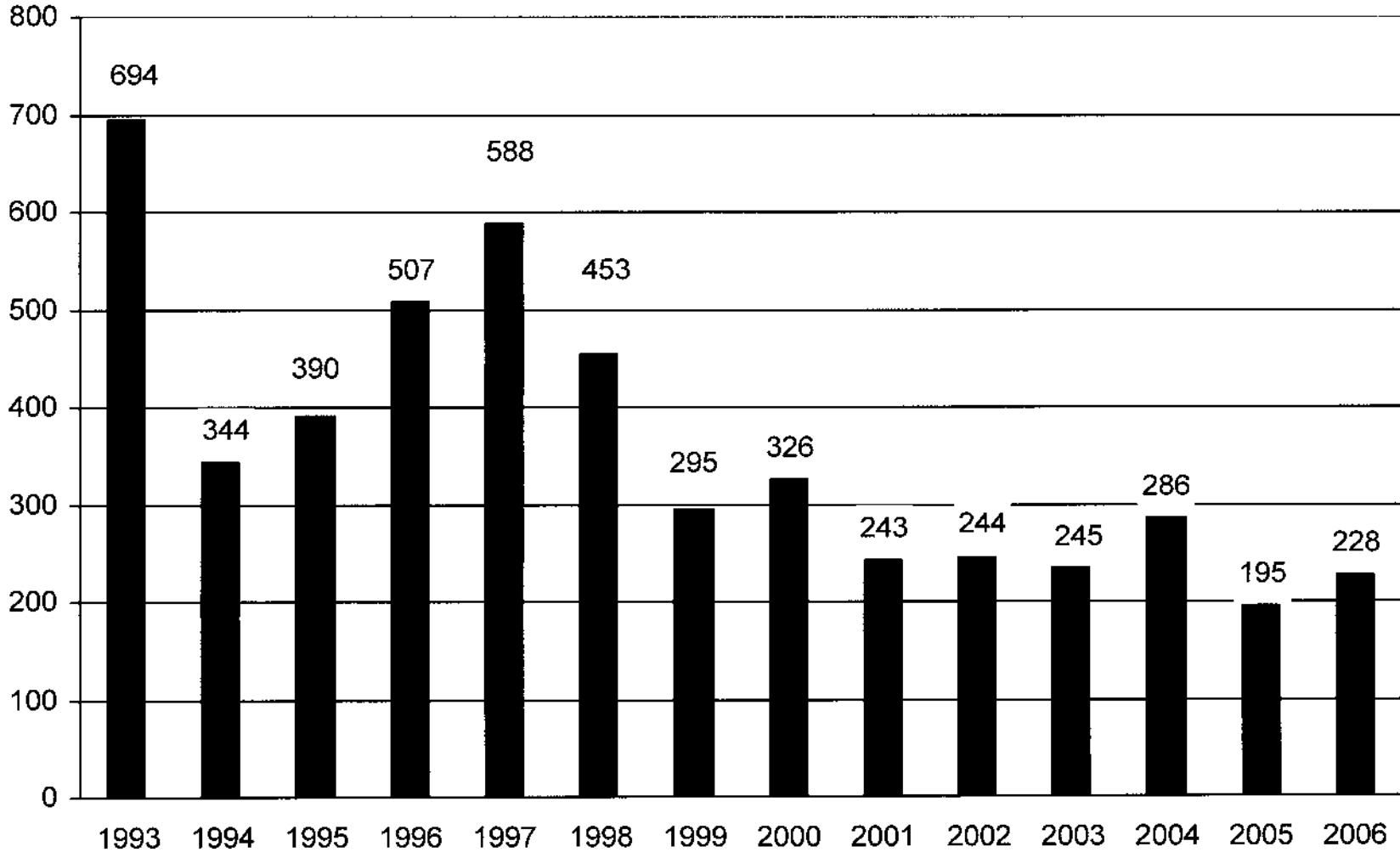

Juvenile Arrests - Residential Burglary

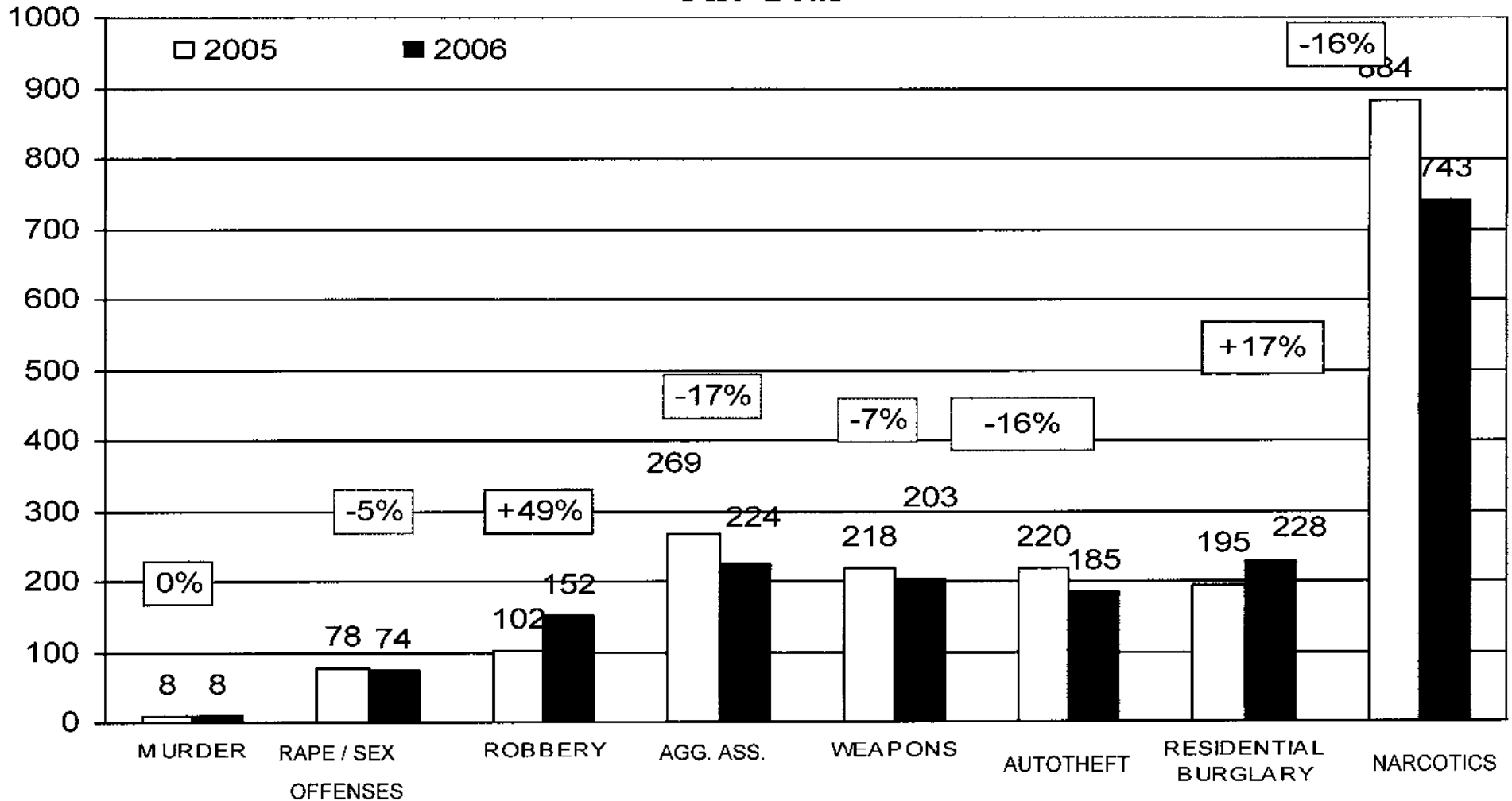

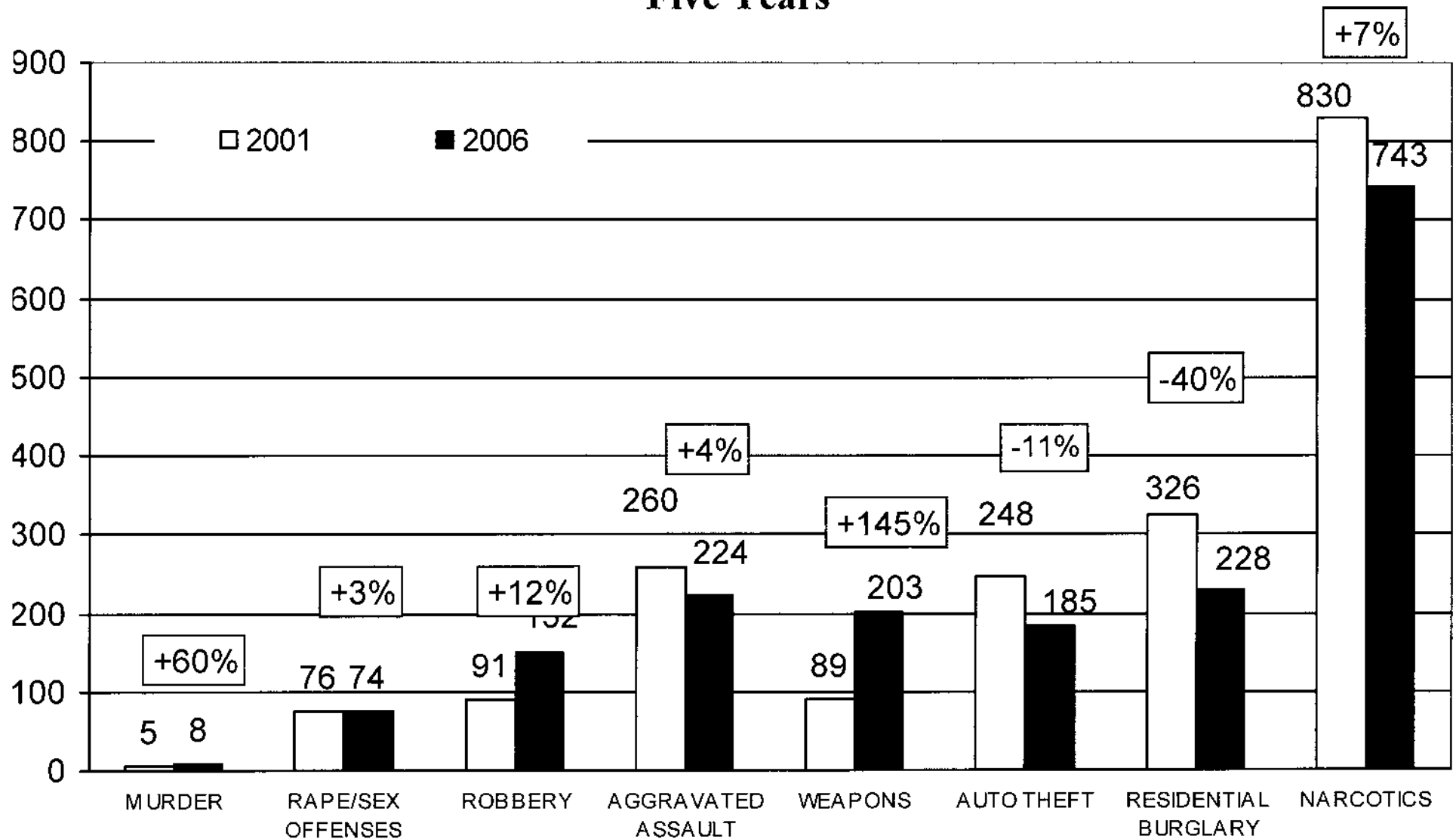
Percent of Change in Number of Juvenile Arrests for Selected Offenses

One Year



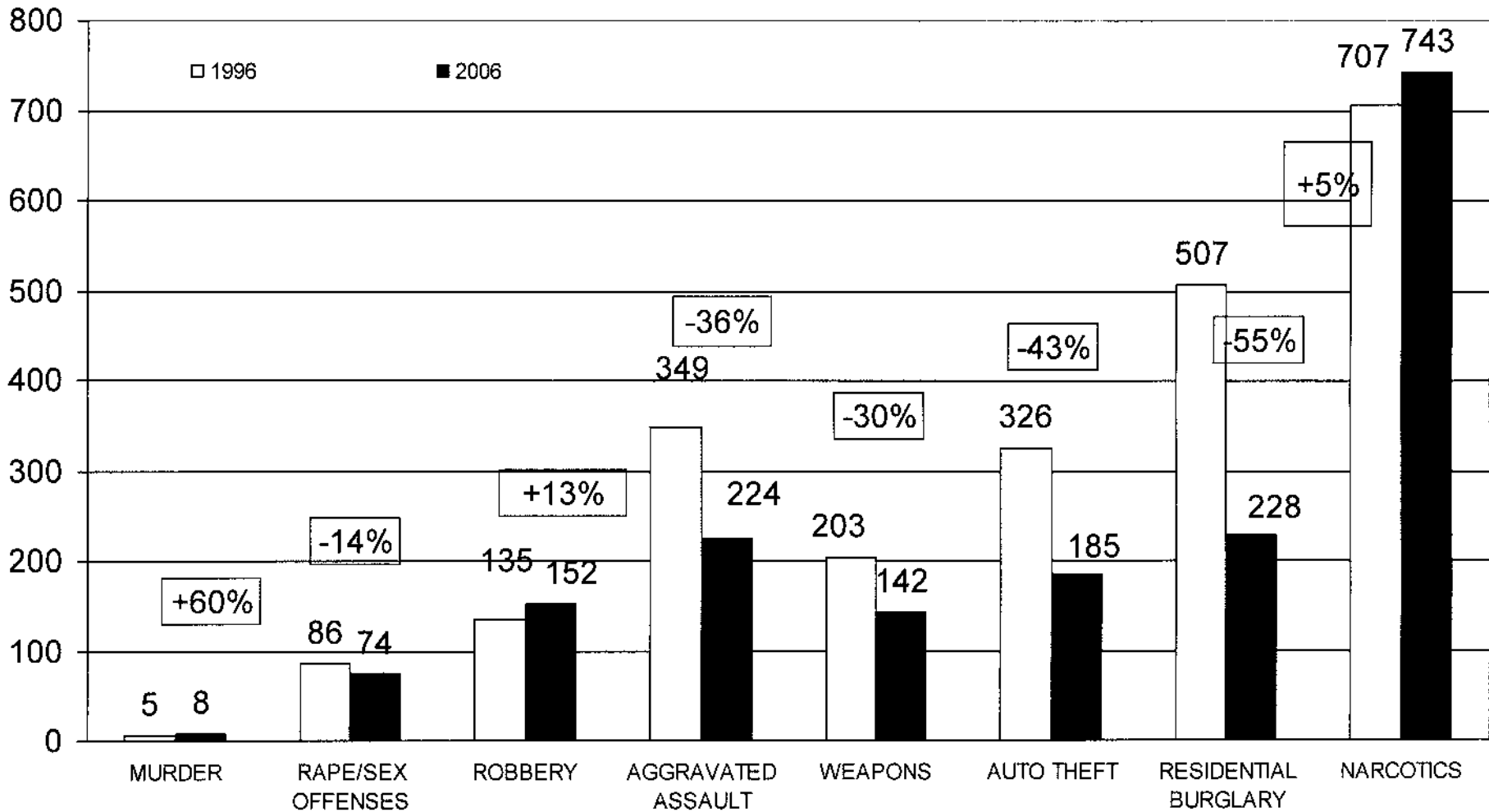
Percent of Change in Number of Juvenile Arrests for Selected Offenses

Five Years



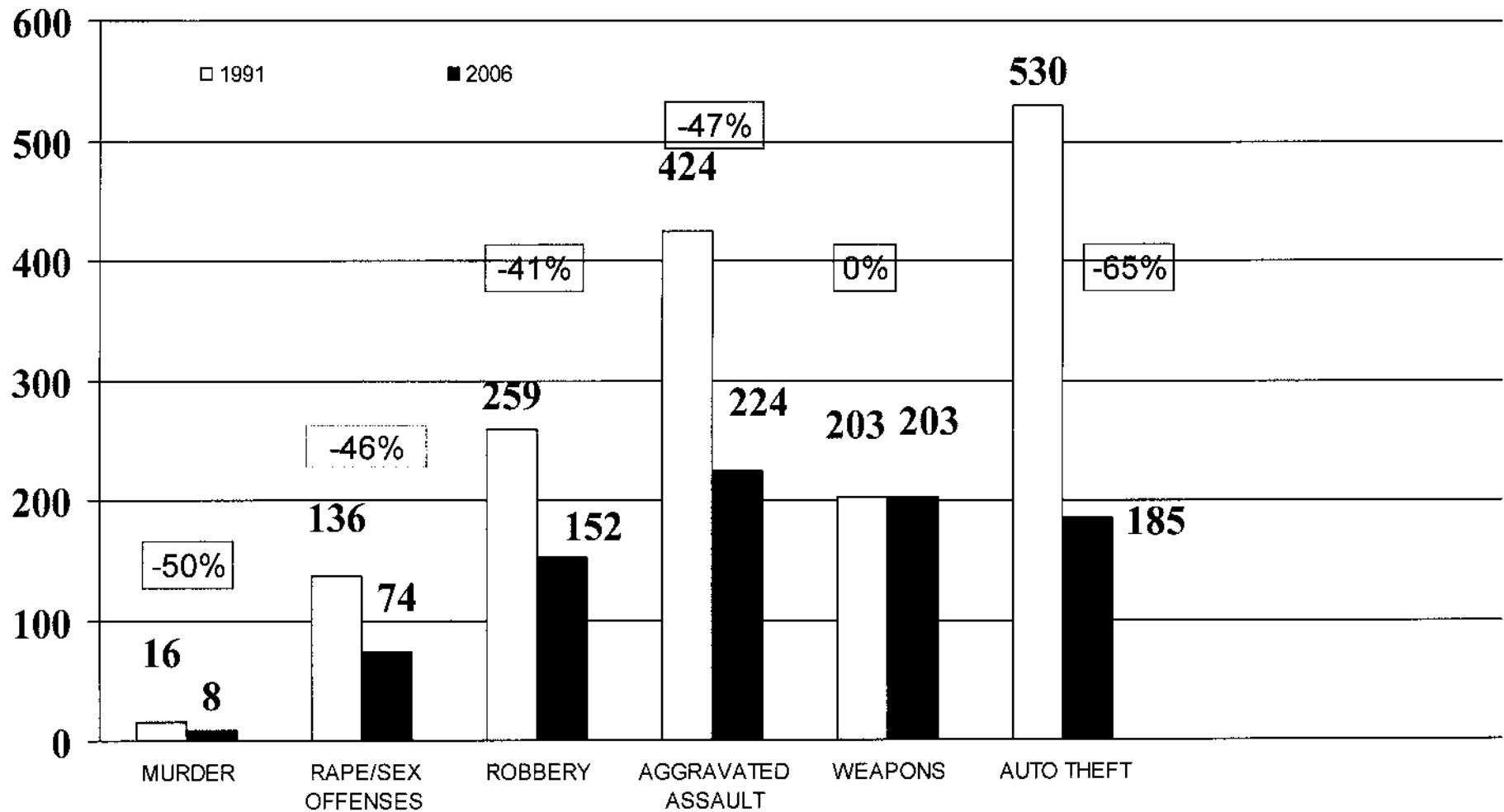
Percent of Change in Number of Juvenile Arrests for Selected Offenses

Ten Years



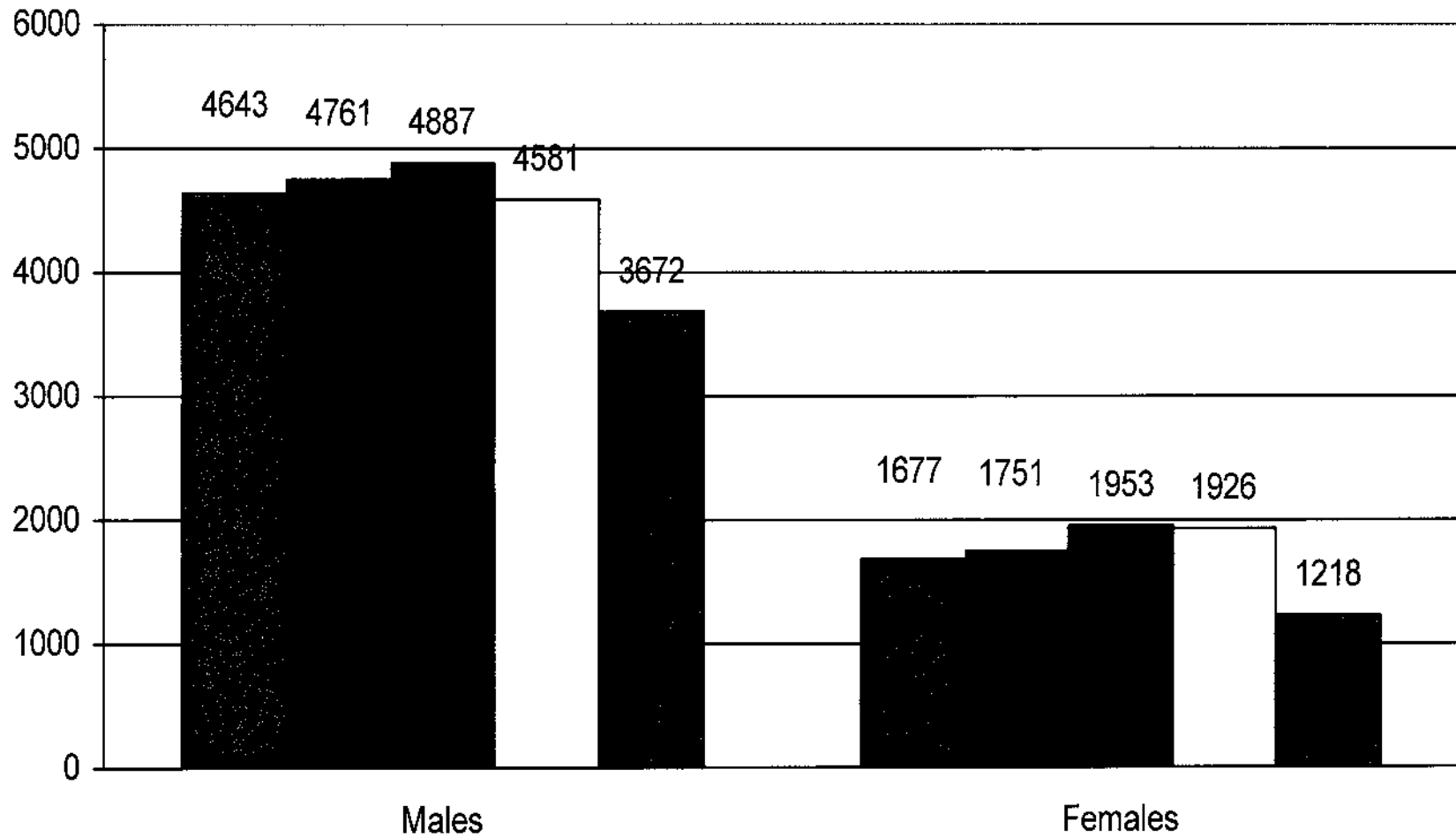
Percent of Change in Number of Juvenile Arrests for Selected Offenses

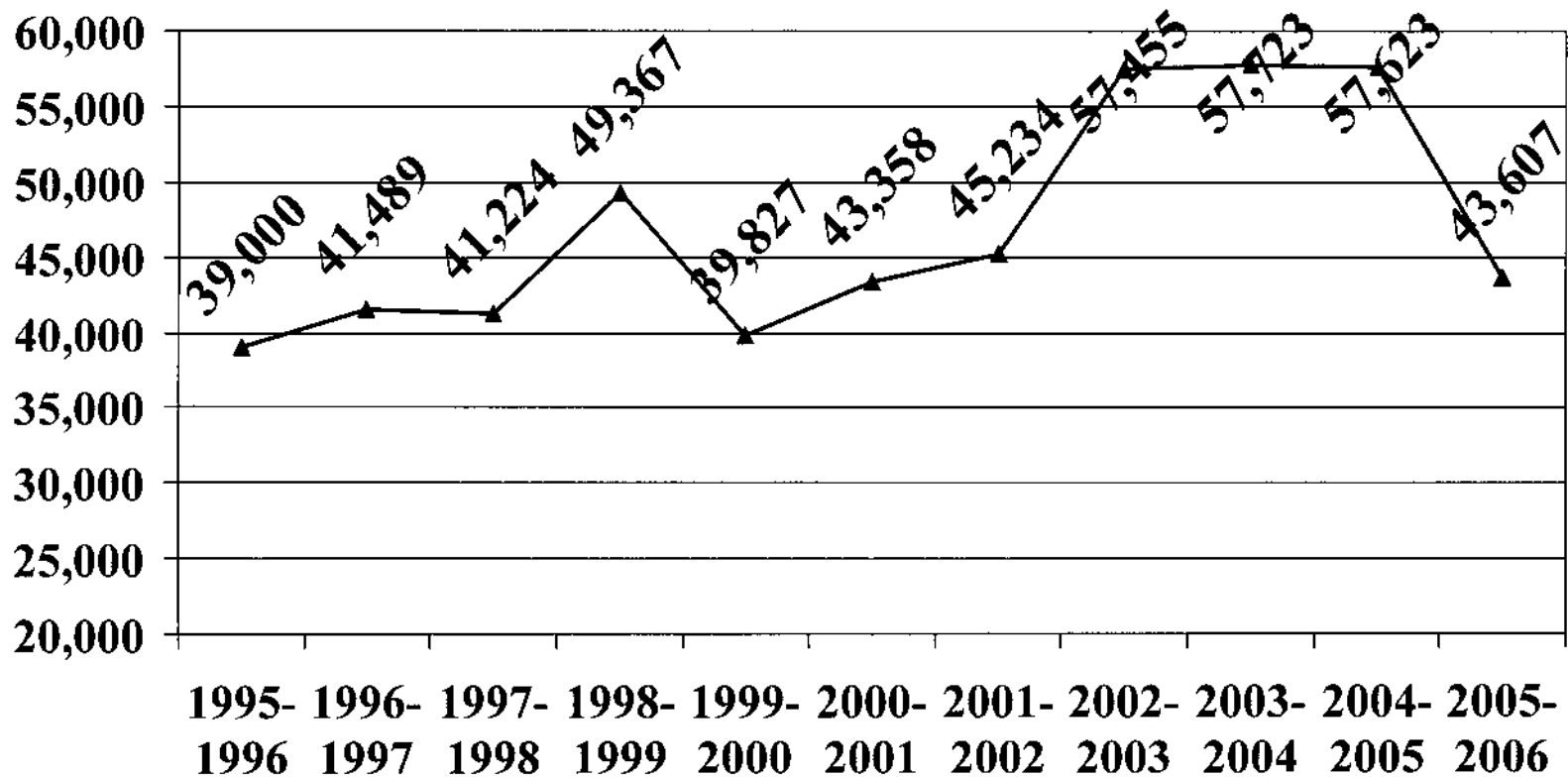

Number of out of school suspensions

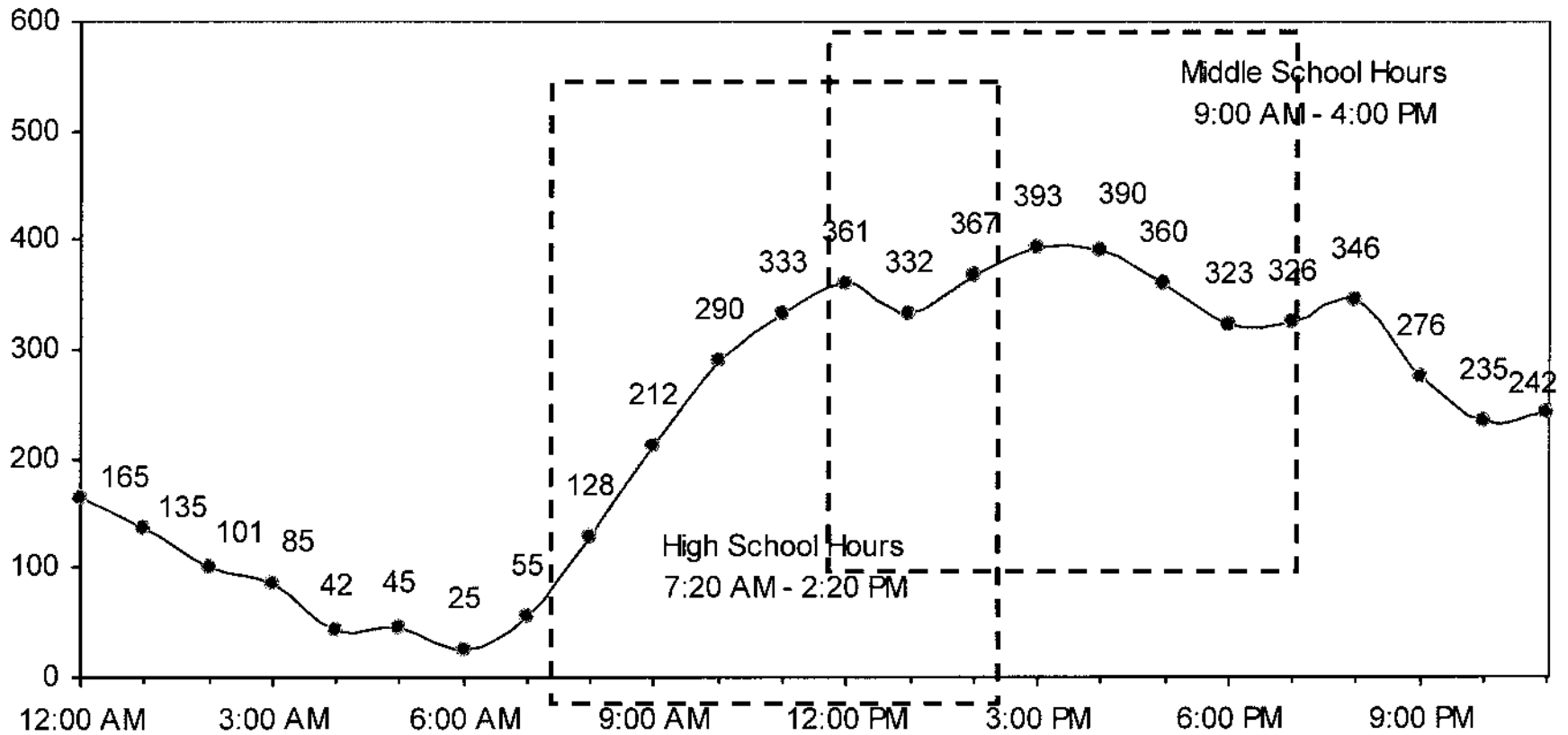

An Evaluation of Juvenile Innovations in Duval County, Florida

Florida State University

- The Program for At-risk Students may have averted as many as 1,500 property crimes between 1993 and 1995.
- A conservative estimate of the gross public benefit of this reduced level of property crime is valued at about \$6 million a year or \$21,000 per offender.
- Over 7,200 robberies, burglaries, and motor vehicle thefts were prevented by incarcerating habitual offenders between 1992 and 1995. Since some violent crimes were also averted, this is a conservative estimate of the program's impact on public safety.

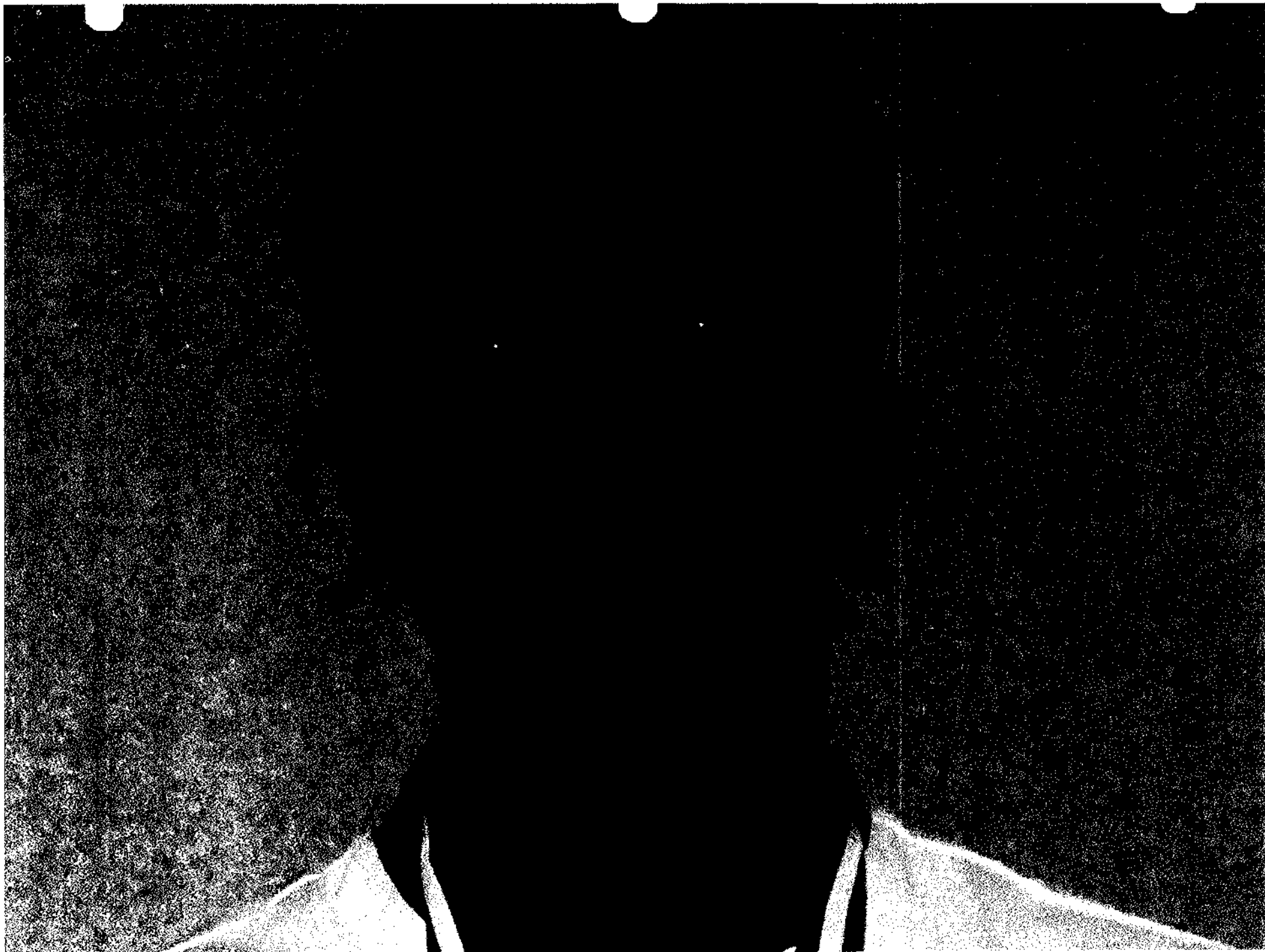
Aggressive Prosecution

Since 1991 we have filed over **2,800** juvenile cases in adult court. The overwhelming majority of these juveniles were incarcerated in adult facilities.

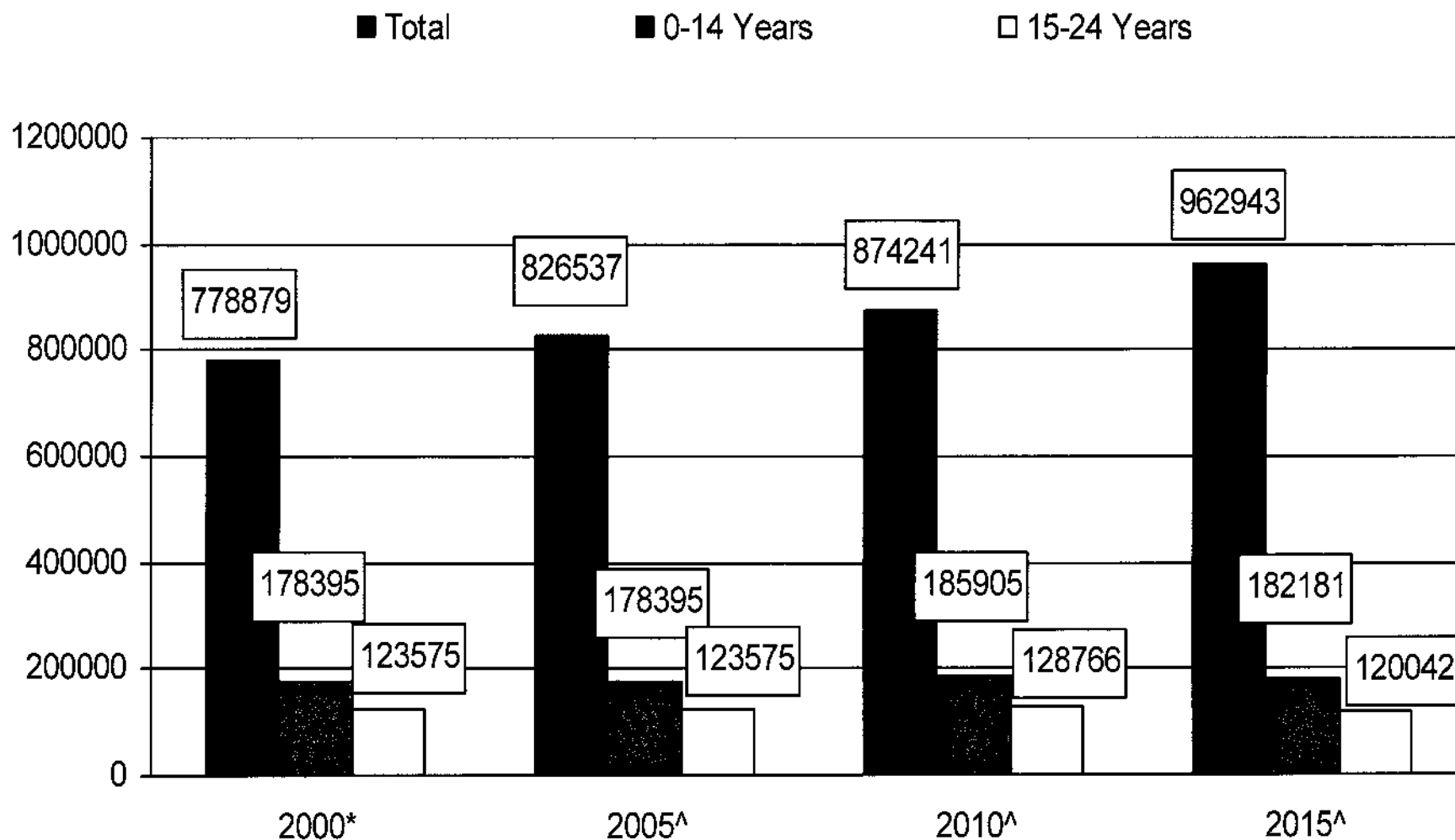
Intervention

The State Attorney's Office has been awarded over **EIGHT MILLION DOLLARS** in grants to implement creative juvenile intervention and diversion programs designed to prevent future criminal behavior.



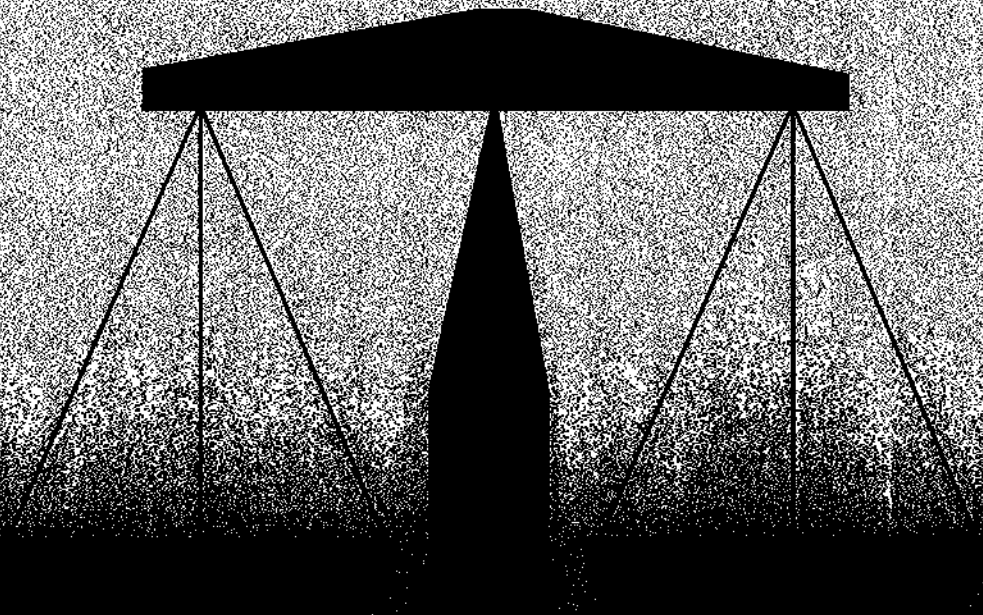


Duval County Demographics - Growth in Juvenile and Young Adult Population
