Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) - Recycling Drop-off & Garbage

REMINDER: RECYCLING DROP-OFF BEGINS MONDAY, OCTOBER 4th

WHAT CAN I RECYCLE?

All items should be clean, empty and dry. These items are accepted:

Paper

- · Mail, office and school paper
- Newspapers, magazines, catalogs, phone books
- Paperback books
- Brown paper bags
- Fiberboard boxes (cracker/cereal)
- Corrugated cardboard (flattened and 2'x3' or smaller)

Plastics

- Numbered 1-3, 5 and 7
- Water/soda bottles
- Detergent bottles
- Cleaning solution bottles

Cartons

- Milk and creamer containers
- Juice boxes
- Soup and broth containers

Glass

Green, brown or clear bottles and jars (discard lids with garbage)

Metal

- Steel food containers
- Aluminum cans
- Aluminum baking pans

WHAT CAN'T I RECYCLE?

These items are not accepted:

 Any #4 Plastics (LDPE) - Includes items such as cling (Saran) wrap, sandwich bags, plastic garbage or grocery bags

- Any #6 Plastics (Polystyrene) Includes items such as all types of Styrofoam, packing peanuts, plastic cutlery, hangers, and medicine bottles
- Aerosol cans
- Shredded paper
- Weapons
- Batteries
- Fireworks or flares
- Needles
- Cables or wires
- Rubber
- Food or yard waste

Remember, just because an item might contain a recyclable material does not mean it can be recycled. Most recyclable items, including plastics, will be marked with recycling symbol.

CAN I USE PLASTIC BAGS TO DROP OFF MY RECYCLABLES AT THE 14 DIFFERENT SITES?

Recyclables can be brought to the drop-off sites in whichever manner is easier for the resident; however, plastic bags should **NOT** be placed in the drop-off containers. If you bring your recyclables to the drop-off sites in plastic bags you will need to de-bag the recyclables and put them in the drop off containers loose. The plastic bags should be taken back with you and **NOT** placed in the recycling bin. Plastic bags are not recyclable and will get caught and stuck in recycling equipment at the center.

CAN I USE PAPER BAGS TO DROP OFF MY RECYCLABLES AT THE 14 DIFFERENT SITES?

Yes. Paper bags can be used and placed directly in the bin.

WHAT ARE THE HOURS?

Hours for recycling drop-off will be Monday through Saturday from sunrise to sunset.

IS IT FREE?

Yes. There is no cost for recycling drop-off.

WHAT ELSE IS THE CITY DOING TO ADDRESS THIS PROBLEM?

Many employees in the Solid Waste Division are working seven days a week to fill gaps. Also, City employees with CDL driver's licenses have been working overtime to help with collection operations.

To assist with yard waste collections, the City has activated the City's Debris Management contractor and has continued to utilize City Employees to supplement these efforts. On Tuesday, Mayor Curry will introduce legislation for a yard waste transfer station. This would assist in reducing run times for crews throughout parts of the City. The legislation would introduce a fee reduction for residents that prefer to drop off yard waste at the existing Trail Ridge facility. Costs would be one dollar total for up to 500 pounds of yard waste. Yard waste would be accepted Monday through Saturday.

WHEN WILL RECYCLING COLLECTION RESUME?

Recycling collection will resume as soon as household and yard waste collections are caught up.

CAN MY RECYCLING BIN BE USED AS A GARBAGE CAN?

Yes. If your recyclables are curbside, they will be picked up as household waste.

DO I NEED TO SEPARATE MY RECYCLABLES AT THE 14 DIFFERENT SITES?

No. There will be one bin for all allowable recyclables.
